

NEW HALL



It took 11 years from an initial report made to LGVA in 1963 on the provision of a new Village Hall, and several different sets of plans, before our New Village Hall was finally built and opened in 1974.

The formal opening of the new £100,000 Leverstock Green Village Hall took place on Wednesday 10th July 1974. Mr. Charles Kirk, the former Town Clerk of the old Hemel Borough Council performed the ceremony.

In his opening speech, Mr. Kirk paid tribute to Fred Buglass, the chairman of LGVA and his support of the project. He also said that the people of the local community were very grateful to Herts County Council for providing a branch Library at the Village Hall.
